Aly Aleigha, their oldest daughter, is now a traveling Catholic singer, songwriter and speaker and has been part of the Partnership for Youth Steubenville Youth Conference team, singing on the very stage it all began for their family in 2008. With this, the Schissel family would like to gift our cluster families with the opportunity to receive a scholarship for their teen(s) to attend the summer weekend conference and possibly Franciscan LEAD (a five-day, Christ-centered, sacrament-soaked, prayer fueled immersion in Catholic teachings in leadership, evangelization, and discipleship – two of the Schissel daughters were also LEAD facilitators). The conference portion of the scholarship is open to any applicant who is attending Steubenville. The LEAD portion of the scholarship is open to teens who have attended a Steubenville conference in the past and have exhibited leadership within our cluster family.

This scholarship is not based on financial need but instead on the understanding of the first beatitude. It is our prayer that this scholarship opportunity will foster deeper prayer and discipleship within our cluster families.

Up to \$2,500 total will be distributed between \$225 conference scholarships and \$500 conference/LEAD scholarships.
